

Student Leadership

Within the school we have a student Junior Leadership Team (JLT), School Council, Eco Council, Al Ain News Team, Academy of Excellence, Playground Leaders, House Captains, Sports Captains and many other student leadership responsibilities.



Curriculum Information

The English National Curriculum is among the most in-demand study options in the world, respected for its high academic standards and focus on developing confidence and individual thinking. The learning pathway is delivered through enquiry or project-based learning, a method of teaching which inspires a love of learning and deepens a student's knowledge by challenging them to complete real-world tasks. As a result, the English National Curriculum is one of the most engaging of all.

In Primary, the National Curriculum for England defines two 'Key Stages'; Key Stage 1 [Years 1 and 2] and Key Stage 2 [Years 3 to 6]. The curriculum builds on the fundamental skills developed through the Early Years curriculum in Foundation Stage 1 and 2 [3 to 5 years old]. The National Curriculum Core subjects are English, Mathematics and Science. With additional subjects offered, including Information and Communication Technology; History; Geography; Modern Foreign Languages [Year 5 upwards]; Music; Art and Design; Drama; Physical Education and Personal, Health and Social Development. As per the Ministry of Education regulations, Arabic, Islamic Studies and Social Studies are taught throughout the school. The curriculum gives a complete learning experience to all children. Children do not only learn in formal lessons or in the activities prepared by the teachers. At AABA, significant emphasis is also given to "the hidden curriculum". School life and education for all children is not wholly based on academics. The development of our students in a holistic manner, focusing on their personal, social and emotional health, leadership, moral

education and conduct to support their wider development is key.

Our school values- Respect, Responsibility and Resilience are truly embed this throughout the school. A curriculum not seen only in terms of experiences, but also the acquisition of knowledge and skills we believe students should acquire to prepare them for life beyond school. In planning the curriculum and putting it into practice, we ensure that excellence is pursued and valued, that lessons are challenging and have appropriate pace and direction. Whether the children are taught individually, in smaller groups or as part of a whole class, the teaching should meet the children's individual needs.

Throughout the year, on-going assessments take place in each year group.

Additionally, at certain times of the year there will be more formal assessments, including GL Progress tests and benchmark/external tests in reading, mathematics and Arabic.

In Secondary, the National Curriculum for England defines three 'Key Stages', Key Stage 3 [Years 7-9], Key Stage 4 [Years 10 & 11] and Key Stage 5 [Years 12 & 13]. In Key Stage 3, students are provided with a broad and balanced curriculum, encompassing the key subject faculties including English, Maths, Science, Creative Arts, Humanities, Languages, Physical Education and Computing.

At Key Stages 4 students work towards the GCSE qualifications, one of the most rigorous and highly regarded programmes of study in the world. Students must take English, Maths, and one Science, with the remaining subjects chosen through our guided options process. They will then complete their secondary education at Key Stage 5 by undertaking A-levels (Advanced Levels), one of the most rigorous and rewarding courses in the world.

Backpack Policy

As custodians of children's wellbeing, we at Al Ain British Academy would like to address the potential long-term effects of students carrying heavy school bags. It is recommended that a child's school bag does not exceed 5-10% of their body weight to avoid adverse effects on their spine and body. To ensure the wellbeing of students it is important to implement a policy on limiting school bag weight.

Implementation:

Introduced weighing scale in classrooms which allow children to check their bag weight and help them to determine whether their bag weight is exceeding the limit. School Wellness teacher and Physical education in charge will be responsible for the effective implementation of the policy under the supervision of the Principal.

- Awareness to the parent regarding the policy and their responsibility to ensure the bag weight before they are sending their child to the school

Monitoring, Evaluation And Review:

The school will have a daily basis checking of bag weights of the students to ensure their wellbeing. Continuous monitoring and evaluation will be done under the supervision of Principal and review this policy in accordance with ADEK guidelines.


